With further reference to the report of the regrettable loss of your son, the late No. 464 Private K.L. SCOTT, 2nd Battalion, I have now to inform you that it is the intention of the Imperial War Graves Commission to proceed with the erection of a permanent headstone (engraved "Believed to be buried in this Cemetery") in the -

LOVE PINE CEMETERY, GALLIPOLI,

upon which will be inscribed the full regimental particulars and date of death of the late soldier, together with any verse or epitaph previously furnished in this connection.

This action is being taken in order to suitably perpetuate the memory of those of our Fallen whose remains are believed to be interred in the abovenamed Cemetery, but whose actual graves cannot be identified.
